Walk, bike or rollerblade along the seven miles of paved trail that run along the mainland side of the canal. Not to be outdone, the Cape side features 6.5 miles of trail. Great exercise and scenery!

90,000+

Since opening in 1999, the National Marine Life Center in Buzzards Bay has welcomed more than 90,000 visitors to the non-profit marine animal hospital and science education center, including thousands of local students.

3-hour tour

Get the full picture of the canal aboard one of Hy-Line's canal cruises. The boat departs from Onset and travels up and down the 17.5-mile canal, while a guide offers commentary on canal history and points of interest.

Serving classic Cape fare, famous mudslides and more, The Chart Room was named "Best Outdoor Restaurant" in *Cape Cod LIFE's* 2014 Readers' Choice awards. Overlooking Red Brook Harbor, it's a perfect spot for a meal—and a sunset.

The Aptucxet Trading Post dates to 1627—the time of the Pilgrims. Once a key location for trade between Europeans and Native Americans, the original structure's foundation was excavated in the 1920s, and a replica was built upon it.

Spend the week in a retired lighthouse on the shore! Rent out the Wings Neck Lighthouse, built in the late 19th century. Just inches from the water, the light features 180-degree views and accommodations for eight.

The Massachusetts National Cemetery serves as the final resting place for more than 61,000 of the country's bravest men and women and their family members. The scenic 749-acre property offers a fitting tribute. Open daily, sunrise to sunset.
