## ONE

The Beachcomber is the lone restaurant facing the Atlantic on the Cape's eastern coast. The popular eatery offers wonderful steamers, lobsters, and more. Live music and beach access—and just a two-mile drive off Route 6.

The 1.5-mile Atlantic White Cedar
Swamp Trail guides hikers through a
swampy area that's home to a bounty
of Atlantic white cedar and red maple
trees. Trail scenery ranges from
stunted pitch pines to heathlands.
Access the trail by the Marconi Station.

## THREE

With the motto, "Celebrating arts, culture and community," Wellfleet
Preservation Hall is a place of learning and enrichment. Restored in 2011, it offers three function spaces for concerts, screenings, weddings, and more.

Often described as the most challenging hike on the Cape Cod National Seashore, Great Island Trail is a 7-mile round-trip trek from the trailhead at the end of Griffin Island Road to the Jeremy Point overlook (only accessible at low tide). Spectacular views!

## 9 HOLES

The Chequessett Yacht & Country
Club has a nine-hole golf course
(with different tees for 18-hole
play), three tennis courts, sailing
opportunities—and breathtaking
views of Wellfleet Harbor.

Wellfleet is home to 13 freshwater kettle ponds. These fragile ecosystems are an important part of the Cape's freshwater supply. Some, including Gull and Great Pond, offer swimming access.

## 20+

A thriving art community, Wellfleet is home to 20-plus galleries, which exhibit the work of local and internationally renowned artists.

Many galleries are open late on summer evenings.

On November 21, 2014, Wellfleet Bay
Wildlife Sanctuary staff rescued 157
cold, stunned, and endangered sea
turtles—the most in the organization's
30-plus years. Visit the nature center to
learn more about these efforts.

Uncle Tim's Bridge, a 295-foot
wooden span crossing Duck Creek,
was restored in 2008. The footbridge
connects Cannon Hill/Hamblin Park to
Wellfleet's central village. Park in the
village center; cross the bridge; snap a
selfie; repeat!

During the 1930s, the 30-foot, cast iron Mayo Beach Lighthouse tower was moved 3,000 miles west of Wellfleet to Point Montara, California. The light keeper's cottage remains, and though privately owned, it can be seen on Kendrick Avenue.
